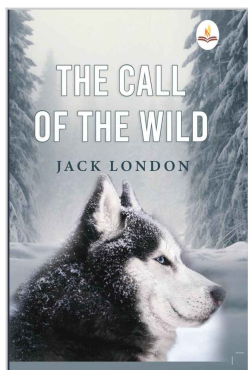

Raised by John London and the Prentiss family, he grew up in Oakland. London left UC Berkeley after discovering his mother's troubled past and went to the Klondike during the gold rush.
